Society of Thoracic Radiology History — 25th Anniversary

In the fall of 1982, 40 plus chest and cardiac radiologists met in a dingy hotel meeting room in Chicago to discuss the possible formation of a new society: The Society of Thoracic Radiology. The idea was the creation of Dr. S. David Rockoff, chairman of George Washington University Department of Radiology. He felt strongly that there was a need for an all inclusive society to represent the educational and research needs of pulmonary and cardiac radiology. The key words would be: “all inclusive” and “educational and research”. If you had an interest in cardiothoracic imaging, and it occupied a significant portion of your work week, you were invited to join. The yearly meeting would provide didactic lectures, seminars, research presentations, and posters in cardiothoracic imaging.

Dr. Rockoff believed that if the society could attract 75 members, it would be a viable organization. There were 117 members at the time of the first meeting. Today, there are 628 members from 30 nations a tribute to Dr. Rockoff’s foresight and the hard work of the founding members!

We are proud of the many accomplishments over the last 25 years. They include:

1. Yearly CME meetings, usually attended by 350 to 400 participants.
2. The annual Ben Felson lecture, bringing outstanding radiologists and non radiologists to our meeting, and the annual Gerard Scanlon Symposium, a focused session on a current topic of interest.
3. Under the direction of Dr. Eric Milne, and the STR, the Journal of Thoracic Imaging was founded approximately 20 years ago. It is now the official journal of the Society of Thoracic Radiology, the Japanese Society of Thoracic Radiology, and the Korean Society of Thoracic Radiology.
4. The society founded the STR Research Fund and the Jack Westcott Memorial Fund to encourage research in cardiothoracic imaging.
5. Under the direction of the Committee on Training and Standards, we worked with the ACR in developing standards for radiologic procedures, set out a suggested 4-year curriculum for radiology residents, and helped to set standards for fellowships in cardiothoracic imaging.
6. Our STR web site presents online presentation and lectures in cardiothoracic imaging, as well as syllabi from recent meetings.

Course Description & Highlights

Thoracic and Cardiac Imaging 2007 is the Twenty-Fifth Annual Meeting and Postgraduate Course of the Society of Thoracic Radiology. This 5-day course features internationally recognized experts in thoracic imaging including the lungs, heart, thoracic vasculature, mediastinum, and pleura, and will include the following:

Dedicated Symposia on the following subjects:

- Coronary and cardiac Imaging (CT, MRI)
- Pulmonary vascular imaging
- HRCT of diffuse lung disease
- Solitary pulmonary nodule evaluation
- Evidence based medicine in thoracic imaging
- Lung cancer
- Congenital anomalies of the heart and lung
- Pulmonary infections: emerging viruses and Tb

Special Presentations by:

- A renowned radiologist and Chairman & CEO AMIRSYS, Inc. on “The Evolution of Information @ The Viewbox”
- A renowned expert in thoracic imaging on “Thoracic Imaging: Advancing From Structure to Function”

Scientific Sessions and Poster Presentations

Cardiac Imaging Workshop, up to 25 supervised cases applicable to ACR cardiac certification. Presenters will use workstations for case discussion.

Expert Film Panel that provides the “expert’s” approach to the differential diagnosis of unknown cases.

HRCT Unknown Film Panel will provide how to approach and evaluate the patient with diffuse lung disease.

Course Objectives

At the completion of the course, the attendee will be able to

1. Summarize the role of imaging in the assessment of both ischemic and non-ischemic heart disease.
2. Summarize the state-of-the art evaluation of pulmonary physiology in thoracic imaging.
3. Recognize concepts in the evaluation, classification and treatment of congenital lesions of the heart, lungs, and airways.
4. Describe a multifaceted approach to the assessment of diffuse lung disease.
5. Comprehend the current concepts of evidence based medicine for radiologists.
6. Summarize the role of imaging in the assessment of the pulmonary arteries.
7. Describe technological advances in computed tomography (CT), magnetic resonance (MR) imaging, and positron emission tomography (PET) as they relate to chest disease.
8. Describe current and emergent issues in infectious diseases of the chest.
9. Comprehend the current status of interventional procedures of the chest, including ablation therapy of lung tumors.

This meeting is designed for general diagnostic radiologists, thoracic radiologists, cardiac radiologists, pulmonologists, internists, family physicians, thoracic surgeons, and chest-oriented residents and fellows with an interest in cardiac and pulmonary imaging.

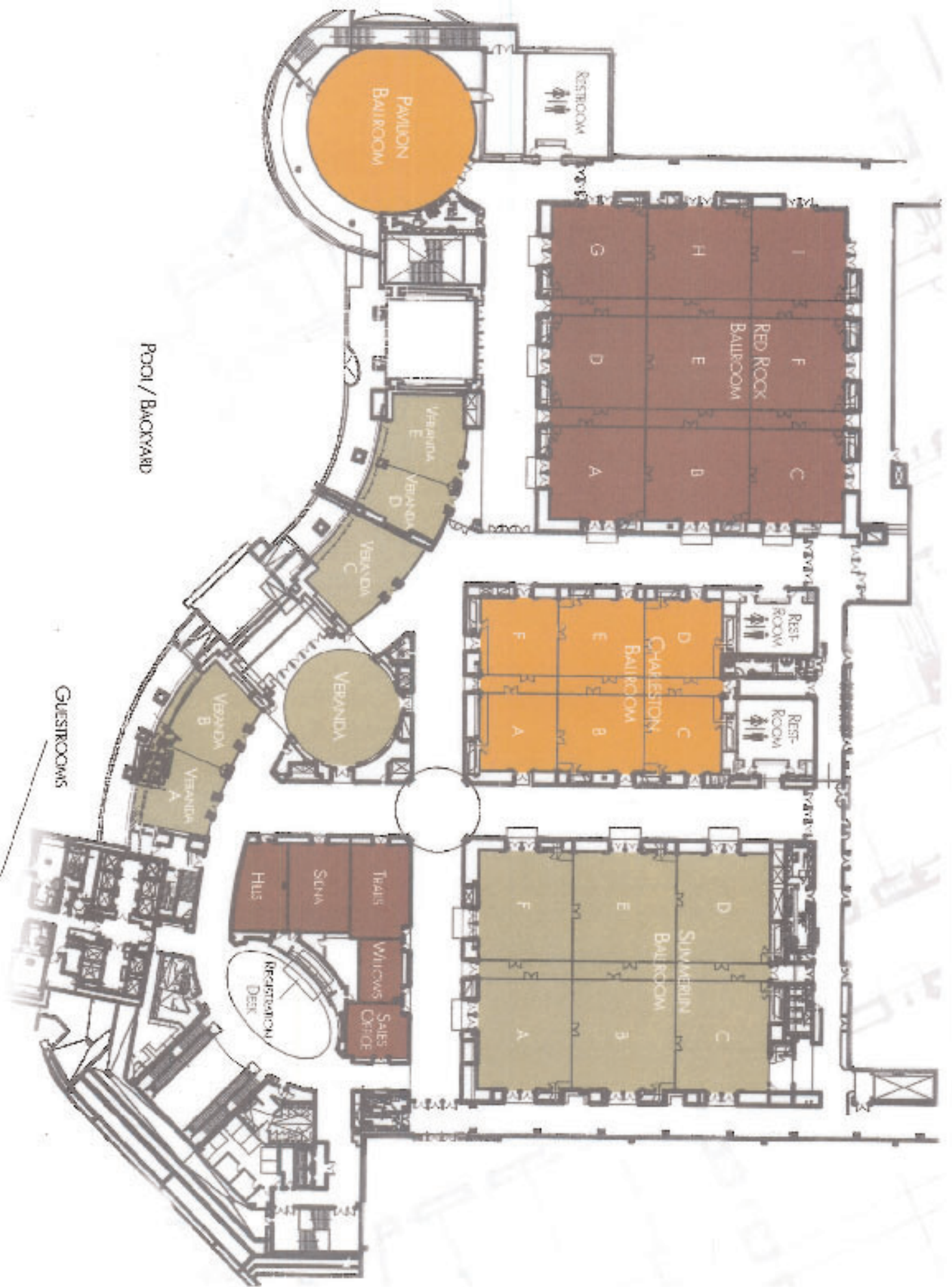
